

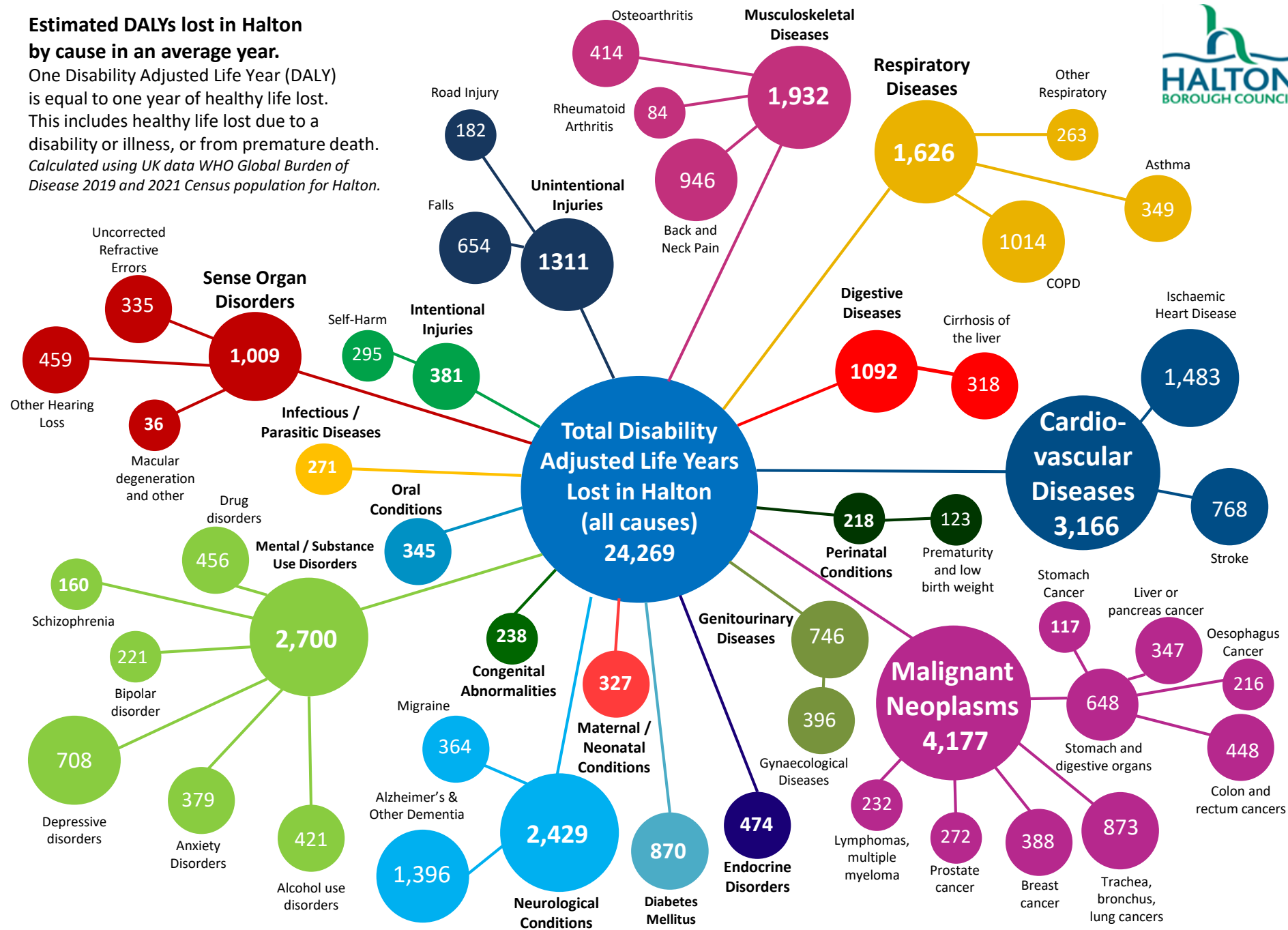
Estimated DALYs lost in Halton

by cause in an average year.

One Disability Adjusted Life Year (DALY) is equal to one year of healthy life lost.

This includes healthy life lost due to a disability or illness, or from premature death.

Calculated using UK data WHO Global Burden of Disease 2019 and 2021 Census population for Halton.

A comparison of the DALYs (years of full-health lost) among the Halton resident population for 2014 and 2023 highlights some key changes. Not least that overall, more years of healthy life were lost in 2023 – 8,091 per 100,000 population. Several conditions accounted for sizeable increases in DALYs from 2014 to 2023. In particular there were large increases in DALYs in the following conditions: Malignant neoplasms (1,654 DALYs), Mental & Behavioural Disorders (1,421), Musculoskeletal (1,268), Unintentional Injuries (627) and Genitourinary Disorders (596).

**Some condition categories do not perfectly align between the 2014 and 2023 WHO burden of disease. Mental & Behavioural Disorders was split into two categories for 2023 analysis: (1) Neurological and, (2) Mental / Substance Use Disorders, but for comparison. These categories have been combined into one category for the 2023 DALY*
