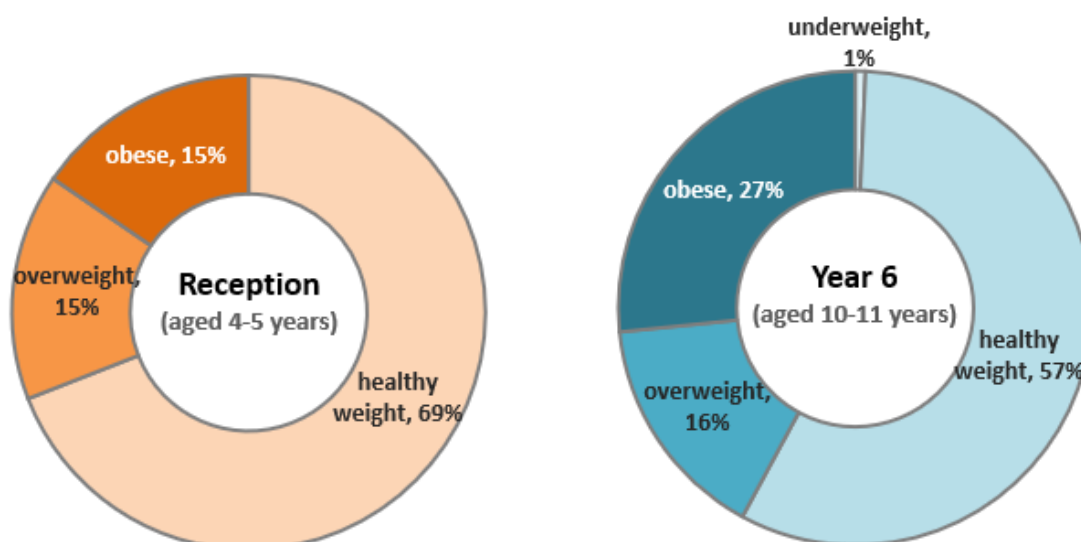
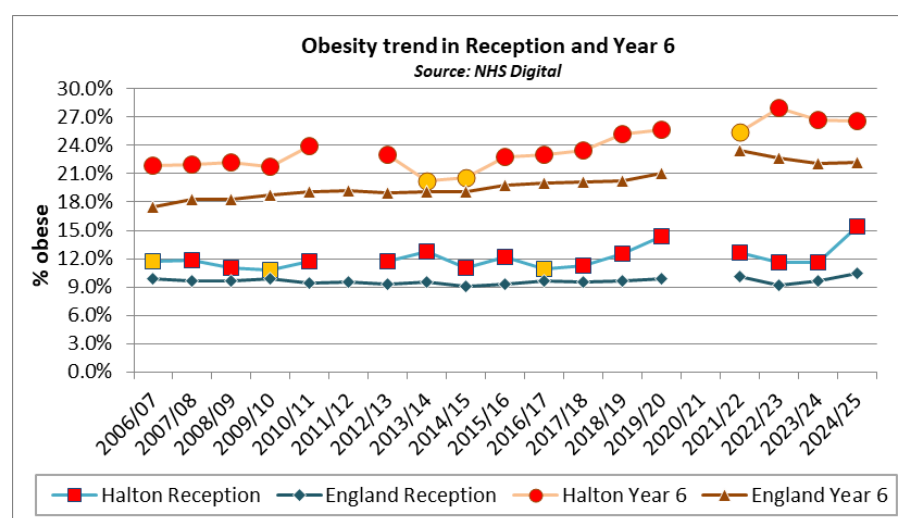


National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) Summary 2024/25

Summary of results (Halton residents)



Percentage of children who are obese in Halton, compared to England, 2006/07 to 2024/25



The 2011/12 data hasn't been included due to an issue with the height measurement equipment used to measure Widnes school children. Caution should be taken when interpreting the 2019/20 data, as some children weren't measured due to COVID-19 pandemic. The 2020/21 percentage also hasn't been included due to the COVID pandemic and only a small sample of children were measured.

The red dots/squares on the chart above show where the Halton percentage was significantly higher than the England average. The orange dots/squares show where the Halton percentage was similar to the national average.

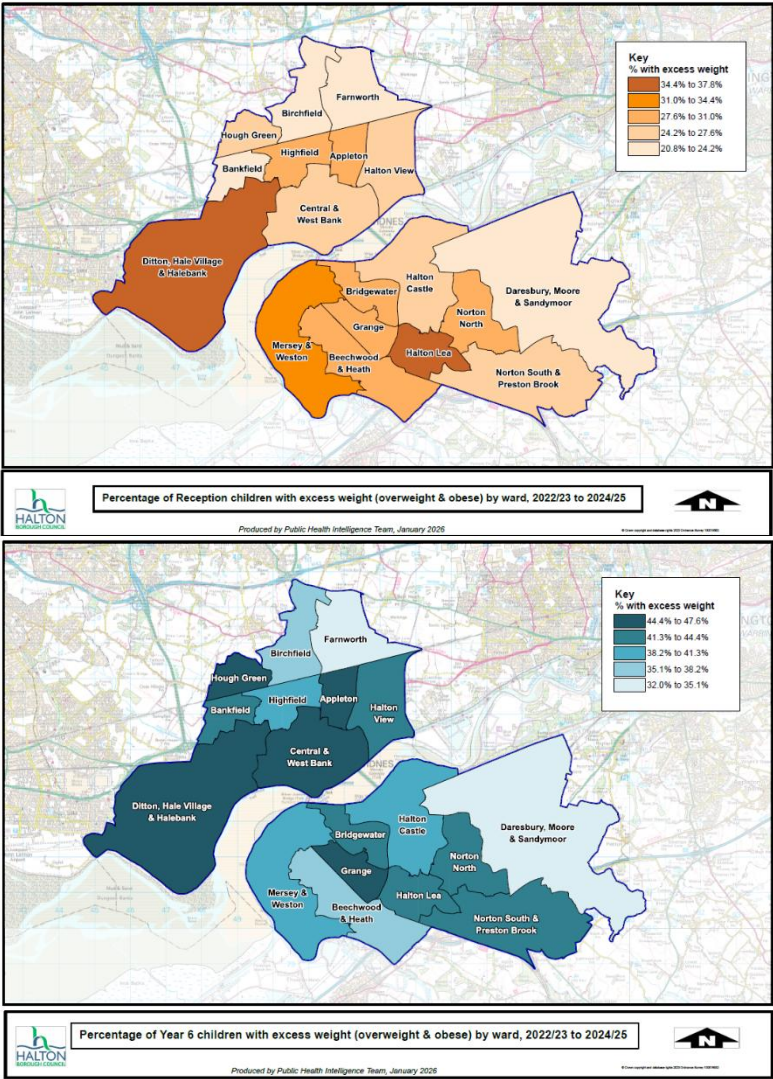
The percentage of obese children in Year 6 in Halton remained at a similar level in 2024/25, however, the Reception figure increased by 3.8%. Both remain significantly worse than the England average.

Percentage of children with excess weight by school, 2022/23 to 2024/25

Excess weight in Reception year, by school, ranged from 17.1% to 42.9%.
Excess weight in Year 6, by school, ranged from 23.8% to 56.7%.
