

Checking on my progress and development - now I am 2

Between the ages of 2-3 your child will have a health development review from your Health Visitor and an Early Years Progress Check at 2 from your Early Years provider

What is an integrated review at 2?



What to expect from your Early Years provider

Your child's key person will arrange to meet with you to discuss your child's progress.

They will write a short report called a **Progress Check at 2** which is a statutory requirement.

The progress check will help to identify any areas where your child may need some extra support.

What to expect from your Health Visitor

Your Health Visitor will contact you and send you an ASQ-3 questionnaire to complete.

You will be invited to a **Health Development Check** at clinic

Bringing the information together to support my development

It is important to get a complete picture of your child's development at 2. Your Early Years provider and Health Visitor will share information on their checks through a process called an **Integrated Review**.

You might be asked to keep a copy of your child's progress check in their red book for the Health Visitor.

Your Early Years provider might ask for your permission to contact your Health Visitor for advice, so that everyone is involved in deciding the best way to support your child - this may involve a meeting
