I CAN Talk Boost (available for KS1 and KS2)

Talk Boost are targeted interventions for children with delayed language aimed at helping to boost their language skills to narrow the gap between them and their peers. The programme aims to accelerate children's progress in language and communication by an average of six months, after a nine-week intervention.

Children who are selected to take part in the intervention will attend three sessions per week in small groups, each lasting 30-40 minutes delivered by the teaching assistant. In addition, the teacher will run a weekly whole-class activity and there are activities that can be practiced at home.

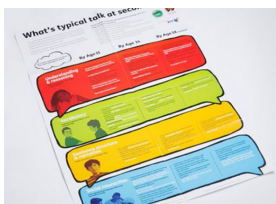
Speech, Language and Communication Progression Tools Primary (4-10) Secondary (11-18)

The progression tools aim to support teaching staff to identify children who may be struggling to develop their speech, language and communication skills. They can be used to track progression over time and are based on typical language development (As detailed in I CAN's 'Universally Speaking' Booklets). They will help you decide whether children would benefit from a targeted intervention or whether they need specialist assessment and support. Each pack is broken down into smaller age groups and can be photocopied.



Universally Speaking Birth -5 years, 5-11 years, 11-18 years

'Universally Speaking' is a series of booklets for anyone who works with children and young people. The booklets show where children should be with their communication skills at any given age. You can use the booklets to find out whether the children you work with are on the right track, what helps them learn to talk and listen and what to do if you have concerns about any of their communication abilities.
