

# Rhymes and Songs

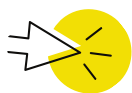


**Songs and rhymes play a pivotal role in language development, positive interaction and early learning in childhood.**

**We have also created rhymes/songs choice cards at the back of this booklet to enable the children to choose which song or rhyme they wish to sing.**

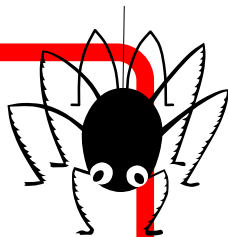

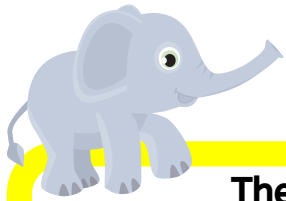


## Sleeping Bunnies
