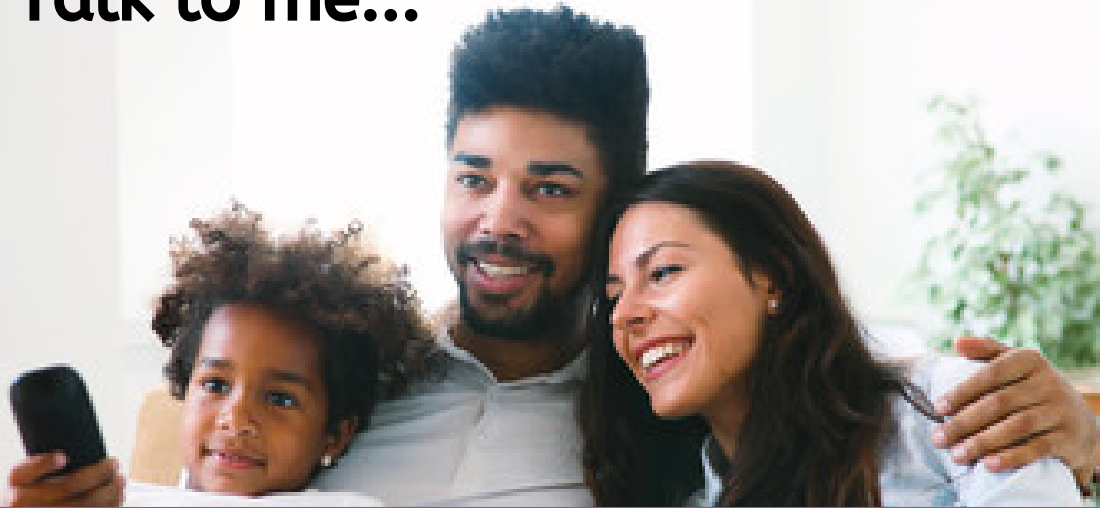

Talk to me when we watch TV together

Children learn to talk and communicate through interactions, so watch TV together and make it an interactive activity.



-  Talk to your child about what they are watching. Comment on what the characters are doing (e.g. jumping, eating, flying).
-  Encourage your child to talk about how the characters are feeling and how they might feel in a similar situation.
-  If the characters encounter a problem encourage your child to talk about how they would solve it. You may be able to relate things to your own child's experiences.
-  Remember when you are not watching the TV together to turn it off. Background noise can be distracting and makes it more difficult for your child to focus on more important sounds.

2 little ears to hear each sound

1 little nose to smell what's sweet
