Data Controller

Halton Borough Council is the Data Controller for the personal information you provide.

Why do we collect and hold information about you?

The information we collect from you enables us to provide you with the most appropriate support from our Weight Management Service.

Why do you need my information?

The information is needed to enable the team to make contact with you to offer an appropriate Weight Management Service.

We also use anonymous information for evaluation and purposes which is used to provide statistical representation of current healthy lifestyle activity within Halton and benchmark against other areas within the UK.

What legal basis allows you to use my information?

- The legal basis for processing your personal data is consent.
- The legal basis for processing your sensitive data is explicit consent for a specific purpose as stated above.

Do I have to provide this information and what will happen if I don't?

If you have not opted in and we do not have your information, Halton Borough Council will be unable to provide you with our Weight Management Service.

Who will my information be shared with?

Your information will be shared with your consent to the following:

- Your GP
- Your referrer – For example, Hospital Consultant, Physiotherapist or Midwife.
- Halton Children's Centres
- School Health
- Adult and Children Social Care.

Anonymised data may be shared with the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) for benchmarking purposes.

You may be asked if you would like to share your experience of our service with other service users as part of our marketing and communications programme. You are not obliged to do so. The information we would seek to use with your consent may include your name, the name of

your child and other family members (if appropriate). You may also be asked for your image to be used in marketing materials and online. Your consent may be withdrawn at any time by writing to us at the address stated below.

How long will you keep this information for and why?

We only keep your information for as long as necessary by law, in line with Halton Borough Council's Corporate Record Retention and Policy Schedule. Once your data is no longer required for monitoring, your data will be disposed of securely.

How will my information be stored?

Your information will be stored electronically in a data base and in digital form. Electronic data is kept on a secure in-house HBC database and electronic filing system.

For those opting to participate in our app-based programmes, service users will voluntarily enter their personal data on to the Nudge Coach app database, where their data will be stored during their engagement with the programme. Users can remove their data by deleting their Nudge account at any time. Data for Nudge Coach is stored on servers in the USA. Nudge Coach Privacy Policy can be found [here](#).

Will this information be used to take automated decisions about me?

No, this information will not be used to make automated decisions about you.

Will my data be transferred abroad and why?

For service users accessing the app-based programmes, if you choose to enter your personal data on the app, this data will be stored on Nudge Coach servers in the USA. Nudge Coach Privacy Policy can be found [here](#).

For service users not accessing the app, no personal data will be transferred or stored abroad.

What rights do I have when it comes to my data?

You have the right to:

- Be informed – through this Privacy Notice
- Rectification – you have the right to have personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete.
- Erasure – you have the right to have personal data erased and to prevent processing, however, the right to erasure does not apply in some circumstances.
- Restrict processing – you have the right to block or suppress processing of your data, however, this right does not apply in some circumstances.
- Object to processing (to certain types of processing only).

Rights of Access

You have the right under the Data Protection Act 1998 (General Data Protection Regulation 2018) to request a copy of your information and to know what it is used for and how it has been shared. This is called the right of subject access.
