Sports Development Team

Halton Borough Council is the data controller for the personal information you provide.

We collect and hold information about you in order to monitor and evaluate the Active Halton Programme. The data helps us plan for future sporting and physical activities.

Why do you need my information?

We use your data to improve the quality of our service and develop new services where required. We use the data to understand how and why our services are used and what difference they might make to Halton residents. Collecting data helps identify a need for the service to continue, we may use information gained from reports for marketing purposes.

Where bookings are made; your information would be used to contact you regards the booking or sports facility/class you attend. Your information will not be used to make any automated decisions about you and will not be transferred abroad.

We are required to collect contact details at relevant sports venues to comply with the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Collection of Contact Details etc and Related Requirements) Regulations 2020.

What legal basis allows you to use my information?

Halton Borough Council is legally able to process your personal data:

- When you have freely and explicitly provided your consent. Your consent is required to process your data and you have the right to withdraw any part of your data at any time. To enquire about your data, ask questions about how we process it, or request removal of certain parts from our systems, you can email us at Sports.Development@halton.gov.uk
- To comply with a legal obligation (The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Collection of Contact Details etc and Related Requirements) Regulations 2020).

Who will my information be shared with?

Your information will not be shared with third parties. Any reports produced about the projects will not contain names or personal details. In the unlikely event of an emergency your information may be shared with emergency services such as ambulance staff or to contact your elected emergency contact person where supplied.

How long will you keep this information for?

Your information will be kept for 7 years in line with Halton Borough Council corporate retention policy and schedule. Last updated September 2020 Contact details collected as part of our legal obligation with The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Collection of Contact Details etc and Related Requirements) Regulations 2020) will be retained for 21 days.

How will my information be stored?

Information will be stored electronically on a secure network and/ or securely in paper form.

What rights do I have when it comes to my data?

Right to be informed – through this Privacy Notice

Right to rectification – you have the right to have personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete.

Right to erasure – you have the right to have personal data erased and to prevent processing however the right to erasure does not apply in some circumstances. Right to restrict processing – you have the right to block or suppress processing of your data; however this right does not apply in some circumstances.

Right of Access - you have the right under the Data Protection Act 1998 (General Data Protection Regulation 2018) to request a copy of your information and to know what it is used for and how it has been shared.
